Please note that changes to MPD's PSA and District boundaries occasionally occur. The statistics above are based on current police boundaries as of January 10, 2019. **For the purposes of Clery Act Data Requests, reports include all crimes that occurred on the campus as well as across the street up to 200 feet. If a college or university only occupies one building or one floor within a building, data for the entire block will be provided with exact addresses. This is also true for hotels or locations hosting conventions, seminars, meetings, trainings, internships, sporting events, etc. Excludes crimes for which no location could be identified (between 1 and 3% of all crimes)**
